Michael Villa is a debut author and father of four from Worcester, Massachusetts. What began as a personal journey to understand why a single pint of Guinness in Cork stirred something deeper became a years-long exploration of Irish identity, pub culture, and the power of ritual. He is a business owner, backyard BBQ enthusiast, and amateur oil painter who discovered that writing about belonging could help others find their own.

Drawing inspiration from travels across Ireland, research at the Guinness Archives in Dublin, and dozens of interviews with bartenders, musicians, emigrants, and everyday patrons, Villa crafts a narrative that blends memoir with cultural history. His work explores how a pint of Guinness became more than a drink—it became a vessel for memory, continuity, and community across generations and continents.
